4. Administration Report:

- a. Corey shared that the GCMS Track Meet would be May 12/22. Student Recognition update provided. Teacher feedback was received. Academic recognition is one component. Another component would be student recognition during assemblies throughout the year- ie. Sports, personal achievements/perseverance, citizenship. Year-end certificates would be presented in PE, Music, French, Humanities, Science/Math for achieving excellence.
- b. A/V equipment project will be initiated during spring break. Gym floor finishing will wait until summer.
- c. Archery Equipment purchase may qualify for a grant. The goal would be to have it in place in the fall. Playground upgrade quotes are being sought. The playground is on city property, so grants are available.
- Returning to post-COVID activities that we haven't been able to do the last 2 years: Marmot Ski Trip- 2 buses; sport spectating, return of school assemblies- smaller groups to start.

- 5. Trustee Report: Anne attended this month's meeting. Board meeting highlights from March 8 include Edwin Parr Award selection- Taylor Pawkuk from SGCHS. Transportation fees have increased for 2022-2023- \$50-75 for ineligible students, \$5 for eligible using the 2.4km rule. The 3 yr Capital Plan was approved- since the request for provincial funding was not received this year, SGCHS planning will be included in the 3yr plan, as well as a new school for the East End of the city. Area Attendance boundary stakeholders engagements are ongoing/feedback is being sought. Small changes are being explored rather than a full city boundary change to optimize school spaces. This ultimately assists with provincial funding and maintenance funding. PSD needs \$55 million in funds to address all the needs/concerns in the division. Registration for 2022/2023 school year is open.

Track Meet - May 12

We have secured a date for our Track meet, which will take place on Thursday, May 12. We are here to help the School Council with a concession/canteen for this event. We can also use any other volunteers to help with the events.

Academic Recognition

After lengthy discussions at our last staff meeting, we will be putting in place a 2 pronged program to recognize student achievement and contributions. First, we will be re-launching our student assemblies. During these assemblies we will be able to recognize students who have positively contributed to our school and our achievement. This might be a team or a club, it may also mean recognizing improvement in reading or outstanding volunteerism. We are trying to move slowly towards the return of previous activities. We are also evaluating some of the positive changes that have come from COVID measures (ex. 2 recess breaks).
