Greystone Centennial Middle School 2025-26 Walking Field Trip Permission Form

Dear Parents and/or Guardians,

The staff at Greystone Centennial Middle School offers a wide variety of learning opportunities that take our students off school grounds and into the Spruce Grove Community. This includes walking field trips to other school sites, local parks as well as some businesses in the area. **We** require the permission of each student's parent/guardian in order to participate in these activities throughout the 2025-26 school year.

These off-site walking field trips are carefully planned with the educational and developmental needs of our students in mind. Our goal is to provide them with hands-on learning experiences that complement their classroom studies. On occasion these walks may be more spontaneous in nature, taking advantage of nice weather to explore the community, but more often than not, these are pre-planned excursions that families are informed of through email or other classroom communication tools.

Requirements:

Walking field trips are considered low risk for accidents or personal injury to students. To ensure the smooth execution of the trip, we kindly ask that each student is dressed appropriately for the weather on a daily basis, and bring appropriate lunch/snacks to get them through the day.

Risks:

The staff of GCMS prioritize the safety and well-being of all students during off-site activities.

While we take every precaution to minimize risks, it's important to acknowledge that there are

inherent uncertainties associated with any outing. By allowing your child to participate, we ask

that you acknowledge and understand this inherent risk.

Responsibility and Commitment to Safety:

We are committed to ensuring the safety of all students throughout the duration of the trip. Our

team has implemented various risk mitigation strategies, including reinforcing expectations prior

to the excursion; including specific safety precautions/expectations such as when to cross the

street, and where to meet up/check-in. Additionally, all students are expected to adhere to both

the school's code of conduct and the venue's rules at all times.

In the event of an interruption or cancellation of the activity, we assure you that our priority will

be to ensure the safety and well-being of all students. As these trips are more casual in nature,

they can be cancelled/rescheduled on a moment's notice.
